SAINT OF THE DAY

The feast of St John Ogilvie is celebrated on the date of his martyrdom, 10th March.

St John Ogilvie was born in to a noble Scottish family. He became a Catholic after being impressed with the faith of the Martyrs. He was ordained a Jesuit priest in Paris and asked to be sent back to Scotland, where he converted people back to the Catholic faith.

He was successful in bringing back many people to the Catholic faith, however he was betrayed by someone pretending to be a Catholic and was arrested.

After his arrest he was tortured in prison in an effort to get him to reveal the names of other Catholics, but he refused. After three trials he was convicted of high treason, because he converted Protestants to the Catholic faith and was sentenced to death.

He was hanged at Glasgow Cross on 10th March 1615.

Quote from St John Ogilvie at his execution: *“If there be here any hidden Catholics, let them pray for me but the prayers of heretics I will not have.”*
